APPLICATION OF THE INDIAN FOREST ACT TO BERAR.

In exercise of the powers conferred by the Indian (Foreign Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1902, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Governor-General in Council is pleased to apply to Berar the provisions, so far as they may be applicable, of the Indian Forest Act, 1878 (VII of 1878), subject to any amendments to which the Act is for the time being subject in British India:

Provided, first, that for the purpose of facilitating the application of the said Act, any Court in Berar may construe the provisions thereof with such alterations not affecting the substance as may be necessary or proper to adapt them to the matter before the Court:

Provided, secondly, that all references to the "Local Government" shall be read as referring to the Chief Commissioner of the Central Provinces and Berar:

Provided, thirdly, that the said Act shall apply to all lands declared or constituted to be "State Forests" under the Berar Forest Law, 1886, or the Berar Forest Law, 1886, as amended by the Berar Forest Law Amendment Law, 1891, as if such lands were reserved forests constituted under the said Act.

2. The Berar Forest Law, 1886, and the Berar Forest Law Amendment Law, 1891, are hereby rescinded.
